What is Rape?

Rape is any kind of sexual intercourse (vaginal, oral, or anal) that is committed against a person's will or is committed with physical force or with a threat to hurt the victim or another person. It is also considered rape if the victim is intoxicated or unconscious and unable to give consent. Rape and sexual assault are not about sexual desire--they are about power and control.

What is Sexual Assault?

Sexual assault is the legal term for rape, but it also encompasses other behaviors beyond forced sexual intercourse. Sexual assault is any unwanted sexual contact. It can be committed by the use of threats or force or when someone takes advantage of circumstances that render a person incapable of giving consent, such as intoxication. Sexual assault can include unwanted touching, fondling, or groping of sexual body parts.

What is Unlawful Sexual Assault?

The age when effective consent can be given by a woman is 16 years. Sexual intercourse with a female who is below consenting age is termed statutory rape, and consent is no longer relevant. The term statutory rape specifically refers to a man's having sexual intercourse with a child or any other person presumed to lack comprehension of the physical and other consequences of that act.

What is Child Abuse?

- Physical abuse Any non-accidental injury to a child. This includes hitting, kicking, slapping, shaking, burning, pinching, hair pulling, biting, choking, throwing, shoving and beating.
- between an adult and child. This includes fondling, penetration, intercourse, exploitation, pornography, exhibitionism, child prostitution, group sex, oral sex, or forced observation of sexual acts. Any sexual act perpetrated against a child by someone related or close to the family is called incest.
- Neglect Failure to provide for a child's physical, emotional and spiritual needs. This includes lack of: supervision, inappropriate housing or shelter, inadequate provision of food, inappropriate clothing for season or weather, abandonment, denial of medical care, and inadequate hygiene.
- Emotional abuse Any attitude or behavior which interferes with a child's mental health or social development. This includes yelling, screaming, namecalling, shaming, negative comparisons to others, telling them they are "bad, no good, worthless" or "a mistake". It also includes the failure to provide the affection and support necessary for the development of a child's emotional, social, physical and intellectual wellbeing. This includes ignoring, lack of appropriate physical affection (hugs), not saying "I love you", withdrawal of attention, lack of praise, and lack of positive reinforcement.

What is Partner Abuse?

• Physical Abuse

Hitting, slapping, pushing, biting, black eye, cuts, bruises, broken bones, missing teeth.

Psychological Abuse, Emotional Abuse, Verbal Abuse

Criticizing, isolation, name calling, manipulation, insults, being possessive, threatening property, pets or family. Destruction of pets and property

Economic Abuse

With-holding money, being kept from getting a job.

Sexual Abuse

Being made to do sexual acts against one's will, having private parts physically assaulted, being treated like a sex object

What is Sexual Harassment?

- unwanted sexual attention from a person who knows or ought reasonably to know that such attention is unwanted.
- implied or expressed promise of reward for complying with a sexually-oriented request.
- implied or expressed threat of reprisal or actual reprisal for refusal to comply with a sexually oriented request.
- a sexual relationship which constitutes an abuse of power in a relationship of trust
- sexually oriented remarks or behaviour which may reasonably be perceived to create a negative psychological and emotional environment for work and study.
